The total budget for this project is increasing by \$1,384,598.63, of which \$1,038,448.97 is federal share and the remaining \$346,149.66 is being contributed by the city of Springfield. The additional funds are required due to higher than anticipated construction bids.

Comment City of Springfield, Brown County. The City of Springfield proposes to construct a stand-alone, multi-use community tornado safe room in Riverside Park located at 211 South Cass Avenue. Springfield. Minnesota 56087 (44.235559, -94.970812). The current park facility has a campground and sports complex. The multi-use safe room will include bathroom facilities, public events concessions, storage space, and open floor space for athletic uses. The safe room will occupy approximately 5000 sq. ft. The proposed safe room would require use of engineered fill to elevate the structure above the 500-year (.2% annual chance) flood elevation. As a part of the project, a backup generator for lighting and ventilation will be installed. Depth of ground disturbance for the safe room and utilities is approximately 6 feet.
